



Some key observations

- The more interaction, the more the obstacles are visible
- Very patchy information depends on awareness and existing efforts to address obstacles
- How do we assess impact ?
- Differences in national legislation is most common root cause
 However, local manifestation is place-based (territoriality matters)

- Only effective multi-level government actions can help

- Vi. Preventive measures (TIA, ex-ante coordination)
- vii. Role of Interreg scope and governance
- Viii. Innovative ideas?
